(2022-195) RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN EXPENDITURE FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN FUNDS UNDER THE TOWNSHIP'S STANDARD ALLOWANCE

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, effective March 11, 2021 ("ARPA" or the "Act").

WHEREAS, the Act created the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund ("CLFRF") which, among other things, appropriated money to cities, nonentitlement units of local government, and counties to mitigate the fiscal effects stemming from the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease ("COVID-19").

WHEREAS, Hamilton Township (the "Township") has received a distribution of funds ("ARPA Funds") through the CLFRF.

WHEREAS, the Final Rule adopted by the Department of Treasury provides that participants may use ARPA Funds for the provision of government services up to the amount of the experienced revenue loss, whether that be the standard allowance amount or the amount calculated using the formula set forth in the Rule.

WHEREAS, government services generally include any service traditionally provided by a government, unless Treasury has stated otherwise. The Rule and other guidance provides that "government services" expressly recognized by Treasury include, but are not limited to, (a) road building and maintenance, and other infrastructure; (b) health services; (c) general government administration, staff, and administrative facilities; (d) environmental remediation; (e) provision of police, fire, and other public safety services (including purchase of fire trucks and police vehicles); (f) maintenance or pay-go funded building infrastructure; and (g) modernization of cybersecurity, including hardware, software, and protection of critical infrastructure.

WHEREAS, the Township, by virtue of Resolution No. 2022-101, has elected to take the "standard allowance", and presume that up to \$10 million, but not to exceed the Township's award, in revenue has been lost due to the public emergency, for the provision of government services.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") has identified a project or expenditure which, in the judgment of the Board, qualifies as a permitted use of the ARPA Funds, in direct support of the provision of governmental services, which consists of the following: for the installation of commercial carpet squares in Station 171 and 172 at a cost of \$5,429.43 and \$6,679.95 respectively. (the "Expenditure").

WHEREAS, the Board believes that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to approve the Expenditure and authorize the use of a portion of ARPA funds for the Expenditure.

NOW THEREFORE, by the Board of Trustees of Hamilton Township, Franklin County, Ohio, that:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, no obligations paid under the authority of this Resolution were incurred prior to March 3, 2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements

HAMILTON TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT

Regarding miscellaneous Hamilton Township Fire Department matters, Chief Shillingburg informed the Board of the following: 317 & Lockbourne Road round-a-bout postponed until September; Rohr Road, westbound lane only to open soon; turn around on Commerce Street in Lockbourne is now open to Canal Road; equipment inspections are underway. Brakes have all been checked on engines; Wade Edwards would like to have Board approval for the EMS training classes to be held at Hamilton Township High school in 2022-2023 school year. Thirteen students have expressed interest, the class begins in August. The Board requested Wade's presence at the next board meeting to discuss; and Fire Department has permission to use the old farmhouse at Warner farm for training. Township needs to sign liability waiver removing Obez from harm if any injuries occur.

New Employee Update: Christopher Speak has completed his physical and Nicholas Willeke to complete 14th of June.

Hamilton Township Fire Department and Obetz are meeting regarding EMS Services at the Fortress. The Board advised Chief Shillingburg and Captain Ferrell that additional medics would not be provided free of charge to the City of Obetz for activities at the Zucchini fest, as the practice was last year.

HAMILTON TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT CONTINUED

Board discussed the need to place a new medic on order. Fire department was advised to complete the specification process so the Board could select a provider. Trustees discussed the need to place a levy on the ballot in the fall. Fiscal Officer Shirkey discussed her views on how much money the township would need to operate at present levels with Chairman Hann. The Board decided to hold a planning session in the near future with the fire chief. Shirkey cautioned the Board that with the current economic situation, all township departments should be cautious with their spending and cut costs wherever they could. Shirkey went on to say, residents may be hesitant to vote for a large tax increase. Some residents may simply not be able to afford this increase, especially those on a fixed income.

EMS COORDINATOR/COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC

Wade Edwards discussed the EMS Training program at Hamilton Local Schools for 2022-2023 academic year. Trustees asked how the previous class turned out, Edwards stated he had seven students enrolled in 2021-2022.

EMS COORDINATOR/COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC CONTINUED

Of Those seven, only two completed the class, for a 60% turnover. Students dropped out for various reasons. Of those two that completed, not one decided to seek employment at the township. Edwards believes this is due to the township requiring its part-time fire employees to be enrolled in medic school or be paramedics. There are many departments hiring part-time employees that do not have these qualifications, Harrison Township, Violet Township and Amanda are among them. It is his understanding that these departments hire them and pay for their medic schooling, after they agree to work for the department a certain amount of time. The fiscal officer stated that Hamilton Township has offered this type of agreement before, only to have employees leave before the agreement is fulfilled and the township incurred significant cost to recoup the admission cost from the former employees. The fiscal officer asked if the school was possibly willing to pay for the instructor, and what would happen when Captain Edwards retires? Captain Edwards stated that he has no idea if the school would be willing to pay for the instructor and he would not leave the program until it is finished. The Board cautioned Edwards that they were not interested in paying for a program that the township receives no benefits from. In other words, taxpayer dollars were not going to be spent to train EMS employees for other departments. The Board agreed to approve the departments participation in this educational program for one more year. At this point it will be evaluated.

The fiscal officer, with the Board's approval, is setting up a new pay code for Edwards to use this school year to track his time at the schools. Edwards stated he spends eight hours per week teaching this class. The cost will be reported to the Board at the end of the school year.

Captain Edwards was asked by Chairman Hann how many residents he was currently monitoring in his community paramedic role. He stated fourteen patients. Edwards was asked how the three captains that were cross-trained, at a significant cost to the township, to back him up are doing in this role? Edwards stated that none of them were functioning as back-ups for him. Grant Hospital was taking over with his patients when he was on vacation or off of work for other reasons. Hann remarked that the former chief had told him these captains were training regularly with Edwards. Edwards stated this was not a true statement. Only one captain has expressed an interest, which was Tom Ferrell. Discussion was held regarding the certification process for this type of position, how often it happens and what is the procedure. Chairman Hann stated that in his opinion when Edwards retires this position will be eliminated. The Board plans to look at this position in the fall and discuss it's worth.
