FRANKLIN COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

Regarding miscellaneous Franklin County Sheriff's Department matters, deputy informed the Board that the Franklin County Sheriff's Department is assisting the Obetz Police Department to clear a homeless camp in Obetz. Trustees asked if arrangements were being made to help the people living there to find another place to go. The deputy stated that the residents would be screened for outstanding warrants, if there were none, they would simply be sent on their way. He also informed the Board that they had 300 calls for service, 45 traffic, 6 domestics, various burglaries, stolen cars, alarms, and vicious animals. Regarding miscellaneous Hamilton Township Fire Department matters, Chief Hafey informed the Board of the following: EMS training completed on airway competencies; auto extrication training coming up, using car from Ken's Towing; he informed the Board of his intention to hold the Mother's Day Flower sale at Station 171, May 7-9. Covid-19 protocol will be observed. The Board agreed as long as the proper procedures were followed to protect the public; full-time firefighter testing for the open slot will be May 25<sup>th</sup>. Followed by the officer interviews. The list is to be in effect for one year; six-day firefighter Carlton Reaves is moving to contingent status. He accepted an instructor position at Hocking Tech; Chief Hafey is coordinating a Covid-19 vaccine clinic with Obetz to be conducted the first two weeks in May. This is a tentative date, to be held at the Obetz Community Center using volunteers; gear extractor is up and running at station 171; upcoming events at the Fortress: bike night May 6<sup>th</sup>, expect 200-600 motorcycles. May 12<sup>th</sup> welcome home celebration for soldiers returning from Afghanistan, if approved; and Obetz is opening their rental facilities to the public on May 1, 2021. Chief Hafey to check what the requirements are for crowd size.
