FRANKLIN COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

Regarding miscellaneous Franklin County Sheriff's Department matters, deputy present at meeting informed the Board that they have had 266 calls for service, 57 Columbus, and 9 arrests. Citizens reported seeing what seems to be homeless people walking around Reese and the Reese/Bixby Road area. Homeowner reported that their security camera had picked up a person entering their property in the vicinity of 317 and Lockbourne Road in the early hours of the morning. Deputy to put a drone up and look for homeless camps in the area. If they are found, the people residing there will be referred to services that can help them find housing.

HAMILTON TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT

Regarding miscellaneous Hamilton Township Fire Department matters, Chief Shillingburg informed the Board of the following: new engine 171 has been picked up from All American after installation of additional lights; two pieces of apparatus are currently listed on Gov.Deals and bidding has begun; fire training at Wilburn's on October 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. Township to provide food and portable toilets. Trustee Hann confirmed with Chief Shillingburg that public would not be allowed on the training site as had been advertised, this was a liability and could not occur. Shillingburg stated that he had taken care of the issue and informed the

fire department that civilians would not be invited to observe training drills on this day.

(2022-312) MOTION TO DECLARE OCTOBER 16-22 AS STORMWATER AWARENESS WEEK

WHEREAS, urban stormwater runoff impacts water quality in (stream or watershed) in Hamilton Township.  
WHEREAS, population growth, residential and commercial development, and the resulting changes to the landscape will only increase stormwater quantity and quantity concerns throughout Ohio, and  
WHEREAS, these impacts cannot be entirely avoided or eliminated but can be minimized and  
WHEREAS, it is currently recognized that control of stormwater quantity and quality is most effectively implemented when people and organizations understand the related causes and consequences of polluted stormwater runoff and flooding, and the actions they can take to control these, and  
WHEREAS, the need arises not only from the regulatory requirements of EPA General Construction and Municipal Stormwater rules, but also from the recognition that citizens and local decision makers will benefit from a greater awareness of how the cumulative impacts of decisions at home, at work and through local policies impact our water quality, stream corridors and flooding, and  
WHEREAS, the development and implementation of effective, outcomes-based stormwater education and outreach programs will meet the related federal stormwater pollution control requirements and those of the communities they serve so that Ohio continues to be a great place to live, work and play  
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Hamilton Township joins Soil and Water Conservation District and Communities across Ohio in recognizing the week of October 16<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> as Stormwater Awareness Week.

Dropping off at Jones, they re two weeks out on repairs; and Franklin Soil and Water is still passing out rain barrels and helping design rain gardens.
